

## The Romano-British Cemetery at St. Stephens

### THE "HALSMEDE" SITE.

**D**URING 1937 the excavation of this site was completed and seven more cremation groups were brought to light. Details of them are given below.

This brings the total number of burials excavated on this site from December 1934 to 1937 to seventy-seven cremation groups and two inhumations. A map has been made which will give some idea of the density in which they were placed; the outlying groups were found in places where opportunity for excavation was limited. I am very much obliged to Dr. Norman Davey for his permission to use the map prepared by him and published in our 1935 TRANSACTIONS as a basis for the complete map I have drawn, and which is now in the Society's library.
